STAFF ORIENTATION

New staff, certified by Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities or mandated by the Trumbull County Board of Developmental Disabilities, shall complete the orientation program within ninety (90) days of their date of continuous employment with the Board. The orientation program shall consist of a minimum of thirty (30) hours of training and must include the following areas:
