Cedar Point Amusement Park

Cedar Park originally opened in 1870 in Sandusky, Ohio. It started out as a bath house and a beer garden. It's called Cedar Point because it has cedar trees and it's on a Lake Erie peninsula. The first rollercoaster that opened at Cedar Point was the Switchback Railway back in 1892. The speed of the roller coaster was 10 mph. Cedar Point also came out with a bird sanctuary in the park in the 1950's. People came in from Detroit, Michigan, and Cleveland, Ohio by steamship to look around.

In 1964, Cedar Point developed a rollercoaster called the Blue Streak, a wooden rollercoaster named after the local high school football team, the Sandusky Blue Streaks. In the 1970's Cedar Point added the Cedar Creek mine Ride, a steel mine train rollercoaster that travels over a lake, and another steel rollercoaster called the wildcat. In 1978, Cedar Point included a racing rollercoaster called Gemini that had red and blue rollercoaster cars.

Cedar Point continued to develop new innovative rides and currently holds the amusement park world record of 71 rides. Six of its 17 rollercoasters are taller than 200 feet and have helped it earn the nickname "America's Roller Coast!"

Life Before Surgery

I had brain surgery when I was younger and I was in a coma after the initial surgery. My parents refused to take me off life support because they had faith that I would wake up. It is such a tragedy, but also a blessing to remember what my life was life before the surgery.

I had everything a little girl could want. I was really pretty and I could do everything - jump, walk by myself, run - but sadly, not anymore. I was also really smart and was in several gifted classes during the summer. I'm still smart, but it's much harder to form thoughts now. I also can't remember anything from the beginning of 6th grade, which is very, very sad.

I used to be a poet and wrote beautiful pieces. When my surgery happened, and went awry, my brain had to switch from using my right hand to using my left, because my right was damaged so badly during surgery. I had many, many corrective surgeries after the initial operation including 4 on my eyes. I can't see as well as I could before and I still experience double vision which makes it harder to function at times. I can't remember every surgery I had to endure, but I can tell you that there were many others on different parts of my body and that they were hard on both my parents and me.

I don't mind talking about what happened to me because it may help others to express their feelings. I am doing much more than the doctors thought I would. They thought I would never be able to talk, walk, eat on my own, or sit up but boy did I prove them wrong. I guess doctors don't know everything. I am so thankful to be alive. Sa' la vie - that is life.

What is 3E Love you ask? It is a company started in Chicago by siblings Annie and Stevie Hopkins in 2007. Annie created and used the "Wheelchair Heart Symbol" for a tattoo she got while at the University of Illinois. There she found her calling in life to be an advocate and leader in the community.

Both Stevie and Annie knew that eventually they wanted to make a difference using the symbol. The first step was when they incorporated 3E Love, LLC and legally protected the symbol. 3E Love stands for Embrace Diversity, Educate Community, and Empower Each Other. They began making t-shirts with the symbol and logo and the shirts were selling fast. in January of 2009 Annie Hopkins went into the hospital for a simple procedure and unfortunately had unexpected complications which led to her passing. Annie's work in advocacy had only just begun, and 3E Love had not even taken off yet. Driven with support and love from family, friends, and the Chicago disability community, Stevie knew he needed to continue with the plan he and his sister had started. He knew it would be difficult without her charism, passion for advocacy, and disability studies education, but he sought to do his best to spread her symbol and accompanying message to embrace, educate, empower, and love of life.

Stevie was able to quickly spread the word about 3E Love through Facebook and disability-related expos across the country. The company has sold tens of thousands of items to customers in all 50 states and over 20 countries. Today the warehouse is stocked and Stevie has a fire lit under him to continue to legacy of Annie's vision! But he knows he cannot

accomplish Annie's goals alone.



I had the pleasure of touring 3E Love and meeting Stevie when i took a trip to Chicago to visit family.
