How My Service Dog Helped Me

My name is Natalie Morgan-Martin and I have spastic quad cerebral palsy. Quad means 4 - 2 arms and 2 legs. Today I'm going to tell you about a special animal that helps people with different disabilities. This type of animal is called a service animal.



There are different types of service animals, including autism service animals, service animals that can alert to seizures, and service animals for veterans. Today I'm going to focus on the type of service animal that my dog, Peepers, is which is a mobility service animal.

When I was younger, my doctor recommended that I use a service animal to assist with my disability. My mom and I started to research how much a service animal would cost and it turns out that we would need to raise \$13,000. We knew that it would be a lot of money, but we didn't get discouraged because we had the support of the community. Through Champion Middle School and some local businesses, we raised enough money to purchase Peepers when I was 16 years old.

When I first got Peepers, she was one-year old and I just started petting her. My mom asked me if I liked Peepers now that I met her in person and I told her that I was so happy and excited to finally meet and take home my service dog. We had to go through training with Peepers for 10 days at "4 Paws for Ability". Peepers has 3 sisters that are also service dogs, but they are seizure support dogs. They all came from the same litter of puppies, and it was called "P is for Perfect".

The service that Peepers has provided for me was comfort when I was gong through procedures by giving me her paw, she would pick up objects that I dropped and give them back to me, and she would even hit the button on wheelchair accessible doors so I could go through in my wheelchair. Peepers is retired and no longer has to work, so she enjoys sleeping on he couch, lounging, having fun, and she even comes in my room just to keep me company at night. In conclusion, service dogs provide people with disabilities great company throughout their lives.
